

Underneath the obsession of the space race that gripped America, the Mercury 13 women were aviation pioneers who emerged thirsty for a new frontier, but whose time would have to wait. The film tells the definitive story of thirteen truly remarkable women who reached for the stars but were ahead of their time. The Decision That Decided the Outcome of the Civil War: Fort Sumter Falls, Mr. Lincoln Asks for a New Army, and Seven States Think About Leaving the Union

Without a doubt, the most consequential decision of the Civil War era occurred in the aftermath of President Lincoln's April 1861 call for 75,000 volunteers, when seven states that until then had remained loyal (Ark, KY, MD, MO, NC, TN, and VA) decided anew whether to leave the Union. In the end, four states joined the Confederacy, but Kentucky, Maryland, and Missouri remained with the Union. The tale of how things got to that state and how those individual states decided is a tale of larger than life characters, high stakes, drama, and political skulduggery.
