The theme for National Library Week was "There's More to the Story." Libraries offer so much more to our communities than just books and we want to share our story about who we are with you!

The mission of the Adams County Library System (ACLS) is to connect people to opportunities that enrich their lives through the core values of stewardship, excellence and trustworthiness. The ACLS is a non-profit organization providing county-wide library services. The ACLS receives approximately 50% of its operating income from Adams County and local municipalities. This local financial effort qualifies the ACLS for Quality State Aid. Pennsylvania State Aid accounts for approximately 20% of Library System funding.

It is a common misconception that the ACLS is a county government department, however, as a nonprofit organization, the Library System must raise 30% of our annual budget. We rely on grants and donations for funding that we use to continue and expand library programs and services.

The ACLS consists of six libraries located in Gettysburg, Biglerville, Carroll Valley, East Berlin, Littlestown and New Oxford. The Gettysburg location serves as the hub of the Adams County Library System, serving as the largest branch library and headquarters for administration and support services.

All ACLS branches offer access to materials for infants through adults including books, periodicals, audiobooks, and dvds. Each branch also provides year-round programming, in the form of storytimes, book clubs and presentations that reflect the unique personalities of their local communities The virtual branch makes digital resources available both within the libraries and remotely. These resources include ebooks and eaudiobooks, digital magazines and newspapers, streaming and downloadable music as well as online language learning, career and resume support, and most recently, the New York Times.

Free high-speed internet access is available in every branch via public computers and wifi. One-onone tech help is available too, if you are new to technology and need assistance with searching the internet, using word processing or need help using your new phone or tablet. Stop in or call your favorite branch for an appointment. Services such as copying, printing and faxing are available for a minimal charge.

Several branches have meeting rooms available for use by individuals and community organizations. These can be reserved online at www.adamslibrary.org under the Services tab or by requesting assistance from any staff member.







Lessons from Eisenhower & D-Day

Dwight D. Eisenhower faced a daunting assignment when given command over the Allied forces for the D-Day invasion in World War II. 


