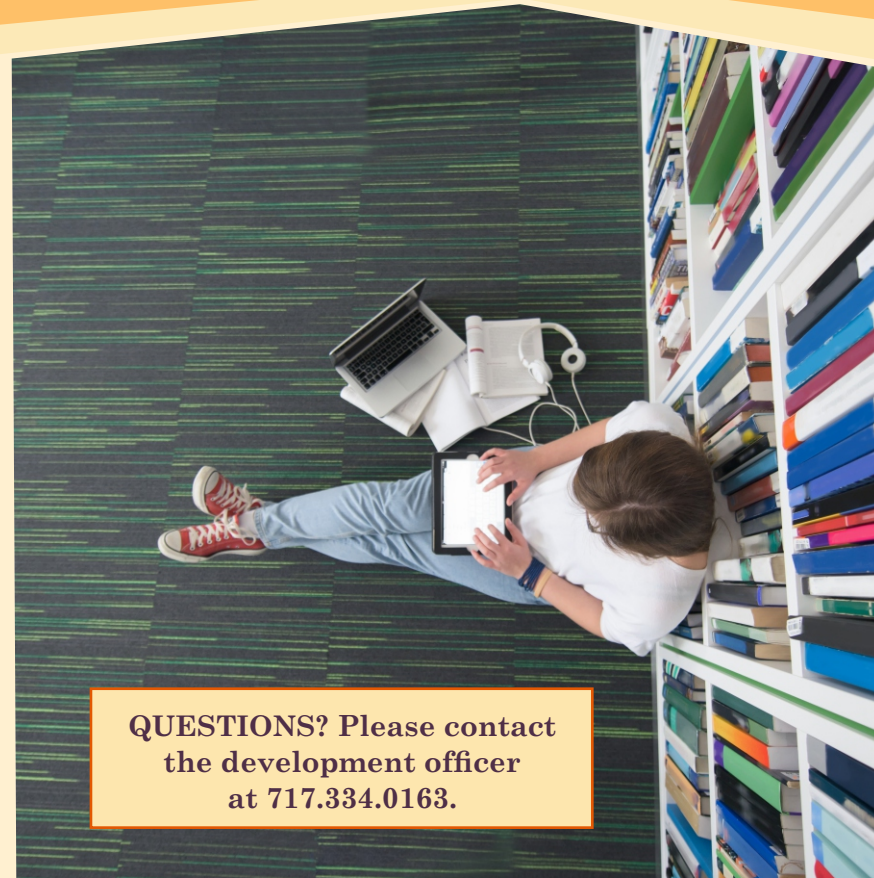

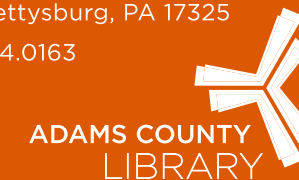

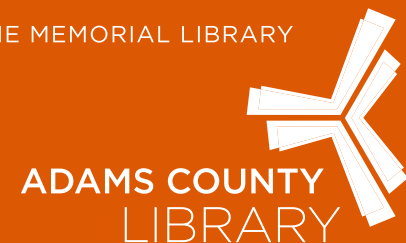

A FUTURE GIFT THROUGH PLANNED GIVING

Bequests and planned gifts benefit the future of the ACLS. *We encourage you to work with an expert when considering planned giving.*

- A charitable bequest is simply a distribution from your estate to a charitable organization through your last will and testament. There are different types of bequests and they can be made in the form of cash or property, or a percentage of the remainder of an estate.
- A gift of retirement assets, such as an IRA, may allow you to reduce taxes.
- A life insurance policy you no longer need may help the ACLS.
- The ACLS can accept gifts of stocks, bonds, CDs or real estate.
