#### **Early Literacy Extras:**

These five practices are designed to help your child develop literacy skills, engage your child, and enhance the bonds between you. ## This week's theme was: On the Farm

**Read:** Watch Miss Sherry read *Super Rooster Saves the Day*, by Maureen Wright on our Youth Services Facebook page or YouTube Channel.

**Talk:** Talk about all the animals you might find on a farm and what their "super powers" might be.

Sing: Rhymes to do at Home

**Play:** Play the memory game on the following page. Turn over all the cards and take turns trying to find a match.

**Write:** Give your preschooler some safety scissors and let them cut out the animal cards on the following page. Using scissors is a great way for them to practice fine motor skills.
