Early Literacy Extras:

Parents and caregivers are a child's first and best teachers. Here are some ideas and activities to try this week with your child. These five practices are designed to help your child develop literacy skills, engage your child, and enhance the bonds between you. Storytimes at the Adams County Library support Pennsylvania Early Learning Standards.

This week's theme was: Colors

Read: Watch Miss Jess read *What Does Bunny See?* by Linda Sue Park on our Youth Services Facebook page.

Talk: Talk about the different colors. Go for a nature walk and point out or have your child point out the different colors that they see.

Sing: Rhymes To Do At Home

Play: Grab some different colored containers and toys. Have your child organize their toys by color. Even if they are younger, guide them into putting the right colors together and talk about the different colors you're moving.

Write: Color the flowers on the next page. Use all the colors that bunny sees in her garden.
