Early Literacy Extras:

Parents and caregivers are a child's first and best teachers. Here are some ideas and activities to try this week with your child.

These five practices are designed to help your child develop literacy skills, engage your child, and enhance the bonds between you.

Storytimes at the Adams County Library support Pennsylvania Early Learning Standards.

This week's theme was: Color

Read: Watch Miss Emily read *Yellow is My Color Star* by Judy Horacek on our Youth Services Facebook page or YouTube Channel.

Talk: Talk about different colors. What colors do you see outside? What colors do you see inside? What are your favorite colors?

Sing: Rhymes to do at Home

Play: Play a sorting game. Take a pile of things and see who can sort them by color the fastest. If they are too young, help them sort while talking about the different colors.

Write: Draw your world. Get all your colors out and use them to draw your world. If your child is too young, help them draw a rainbow with different colors. Let them use and manipulate the marker, crayon, etc.

Rhymes to do at Home

Colors We Know

(tune: Twinkle Twinkle)

Red and orange, green and blue, shiny yellow, purple too!
These are the colors that we know, way up high in the great rainbow.
Red and orange, green and blue, shiny yellow, purple too!

Five Little Crayons

Five little crayons standing in a row (hold up 5 fingers)
The first one said, "I'm red, you know!" (wiggle the fingers as you talk about them)

The second one said, "I'm green like a tree"

The third one said, "I'm blue like the sea"

The fourth one said, "I'm yellow as the sun"

The fifth one said, "Being purple is fun!"

Five little crayons, happy as can be (hold up 5 fingers)

Coloring pictures with you and me (point to person and then self)
