



Early Literacy Extras:

Parents and caregivers are a child's first and best teachers. Here are some ideas and activities to try this week with your child. These five practices are designed to help your child develop literacy skills, engage your child, and enhance the bonds between you. This week's theme was: **Holiday**

Read: Watch Miss Crystal read *Llama Llama Jingle Bells* by Anna Dewdney on our Youth Services Facebook page or YouTube Channel.

Talk: Talk about what you do for the holidays. What traditions do you have? What traditions have you heard about other people doing?

Sing: Rhymes to do at Home

Play: Play a sorting game. Organize cookies by shape or color. Don't forget to enjoy them! If your child is too young, play a holiday color game with items of different colors.

Write: Letters to loved ones are a great way to promote early literacy skills during the holiday season. Color pictures to leave for Santa or to give as gifts.
