Early Literacy Extras:

Parents and caregivers are a child's first and best teachers. Here are some ideas and activities to try this week with your child. These five practices are designed to help your child develop literacy skills, engage your child, and enhance the bonds between you. Storytimes at the Adams County Library support Pennsylvania Early Learning Standards.

This week's theme was: Love

Read: Watch Miss Emily read *Ten Little Fingers and Ten Little Toes* by Mem Fox on our Youth Services Facebook page or YouTube Channel.

Talk: Talk with your child about their fingers and toes. Do they have 10 fingers and 10 toes? Do they look like the fingers and toes you saw in the story? Does everyone have 10 of each?

Sing: Rhymes to do at Home

Play: Play a matching game!

Write: Have your child trace their hands and feet on a piece of paper. If they're younger, find some playdough, or even mud, and let them squish with their fingers and toes.
