Early Literacy Extras:

Parents and caregivers are a child's first and best teachers. Here are some ideas and activities to try this week with your child.

These five practices are designed to help your child develop literacy skills, engage your child, and enhance the bonds between you.

Storytimes at the Adams County Library support Pennsylvania Early Learning Standards.

This week's theme was: **Animals in Winter**

Read: Watch Miss Danielle read *Virgil & Owen* by Paulette Bogan and *Kitten's Winter* by Eugenie Fernandes on our Youth Services Facebook page or YouTube Channel.

Talk: Bring out some stuffed animals. Talk about each animal and whether they hibernate or not. What does each animal do during the winter?

Sing: Rhymes to do at Home

Play: Make an edible snow sensory bin. In a container, mix 5 cups of flour with 3 ounces of oil(vegetable, olive, coconut, etc.) Double or triple to make more. Add animals and have some fun.

Write: In a pan, add shaving cream or whipped cream and have your child play. If they are older, have them write out letters and numbers that they know in the cream.
