#### **Early Literacy Extras:**

Parents and caregivers are a child's first and best teachers. Here are some ideas and activities to try this week with your child.

These five practices are designed to help your child develop literacy skills, engage your child, and enhance the bonds between you.

## This week's theme was: **Animals in Winter**

**Read:** Watch Miss Emily read *Squirrels on Skis* by J. Hamilton Ray on our Youth Services Facebook page or YouTube Channel.

**Talk:** Having your child retell a story is one way to help them understand the story. However, sometimes retelling the whole story can be hard. Talk though the story together and make sure to tell it in the right order!

Sing: Rhymes to do at Home

**Play:** Grab a bowl of nuts, a muffin tin, and some fine motor tools like spoons, tongs, and scoops. Scoop and move the nuts into the tin. To take this from a fine motor activity to a counting activity for older kids, simple add some slips of paper with a number written on them to the individual muffin spots.

**Write:** At one point, there are more than 85 squirrels on skis! Try to count to 85 with your child. Then, have them draw what they think 85 squirrels on skis looks like.
