Early Literacy Extras:

Parents and caregivers are a child's first and best teachers. Here are some ideas and activities to try this week with your child. These five practices are designed to help your child develop literacy skills, engage your child, and enhance the bonds between you. Storytimes at the Adams County Library support Pennsylvania Early Learning Standards.

This week's theme is: Stars

Read: Watch Miss Crystal read *Stars* by Mary Lyn Ray on our Youth Services Facebook page or YouTube Channel.

Talk: Talk about where and when we see stars? Talk about what constellations are. Find a book about constellations or read about it on the Power Library website https://kids.powerlibrary.org/

Sing: Rhymes to do at Home

Play: Draw out some constellations with chalk. Place stones on where the stars are in the constellation.

Write: Cut out a circle from black construction paper that will fit onto a flashlight. Poke holes in the paper. They can be random or shaped like a constellation. Go into a dark room and turn on the flashlight and take a look at your stars!

Rhymes to do at Home

Five Bright and Shining Stars

(tune: Five Green and Speckled Frogs)

Five bright and shining stars (hold up five fingers)

Up in the dark night sky Glowing as brightly as they can *(clap, clap)*

One disappears from sight, as the sun brings its morning light (take away one finger)

Now there are four bright and shining stars. (Count down until the sun is up and the stars are gone)
