**Read:** Watch Miss Sherry read *The Mud Fairy* by Amy Young on our Youth Services Facebook page.

**Talk:** In the story, Emmelina does things differently from the rest of the fairies. Talk about what made her different and why that's not a bad thing.

**Sing:** Rhymes To Do At Home

**Play:** Go for a nature walk and see if you can find the flowers on the next page that were in *The Mud Fairy*.

**Write:** Write a fairy letter. Use a white candle to write whatever message or picture you want on the paper. Use water color paints to reveal the message.
