These five practices are designed to help your child develop literacy skills, engage your child, and enhance the bonds between you.

This week's theme was: When Pigs Fly

Read: Watch Miss Sherry read *When Pigs Fly* by James Burks on our Youth Services Facebook page.

Talk: Talk about how do you fly? Can you go outside and flap your arms and fly? Why or why not? What would you make to help you fly? What keeps us on the ground?

Sing: Rhymes To Do At Home

Play: Grab some toys and see if you can get them to fly. What tools do you need to use?

Write: Assemble materials and build your own plane like Henrietta. Use whatever you have lying around the house.
