Parents and caregivers are a child's first and best teachers. Here are some ideas and activities to try this week with your child.

These five practices are designed to help your child develop literacy skills, engage your child, and enhance the bonds between you.

This week's theme was: Adventure

Read: Watch Miss Emily read *Bear Came Along* by Richard T. Morris on our Youth Services Facebook page.

Talk: Talk about what animals you could find in the forest and stream. Who lives in a forest? Are they the same animals that live in a stream?

Sing: Rhymes To Do At Home

Play: Go outside and have an outdoor adventure. What things do you discover along the way?

Write: On your outdoor adventure, collect some things you find. Leaves, sticks, pictures. Make a collage out of what you find.
