Early Literacy Extras:

Parents and caregivers are a child's first and best teachers. Here are some ideas and activities to try this week with your child. These five practices are designed to help your child develop literacy skills, engage your child, and enhance the bonds between you. Storytimes at the Adams County Library support Pennsylvania Early Learning Standards.

This week's theme was: Animals

Read: Watch Miss Jess read *Say Hello Like This* by Mary Murphy on our Youth Services Facebook page.

Talk: How do we say hello? Does each person say hello the same way? Is there a way to say hello other than with your mouth?

Sing: Rhymes To Do At Home

Play: Get out your stuffed animals. Play with them and if they are old enough, have your child say the sounds each animal makes.

Write: Draw your own animal on the next page.
