This week's theme was: Colors

Read: Watch Miss Theresa read *Dog's Colorful Day* by Emma Dodd and *Cat's Colors* by Airlie Anderson on our Youth Services Facebook page.

Talk: Talk about the different colors. Go for a nature walk and point out or have your child point out the different colors that they see.

Sing: Rhymes To Do At Home

Play: Colors are everywhere. Have fun with a color scavenger hunt. Call out a color and have your child find something that color.

Write: Can you give dog the correct spots on the next page?

Rhymes To Do At Home

Rainbow Colors

(Tune: Twinkle, Twinkle Little Star)

Green Says Go
