#### Early Literacy Extras:

These five practices are designed to help your child develop literacy skills, engage your child, and enhance the bonds between you. ## This week's theme was: Dogzilla

**Read:** Watch Miss Sherry read *Dogzilla* by Dav Pilkey on our Youth Services Facebook page.

**Talk:** In the story, Mousopolis is about to have a BB-Q when it is interrupted by Dogzilla. Talk about things that can interrupt your picnic or fun day planned. What things do you have to do now to make sure that they happen?

Sing: Rhymes To Do At Home

**Play:** Grab some toys, make your own Mousopolis, and play Dogzilla. Make sure to clean up your mess after you're done.

**Write:** Dav Pilkey wrote Dogzilla by illustrating, or drawing, a picture around pictures of his own dog. Take a picture, it can be a picture that you've taken or a picture from a magazine or newspaper, cut a person or animal out from the picture and draw a scene around it, just like the author and illustrator.
