Early Literacy Extras:

Parents and caregivers are a child's first and best teachers. Here are some ideas and activities to try this week with your child. These five practices are designed to help your child develop literacy skills, engage your child, and enhance the bonds between you. Storytimes at the Adams County Library support Pennsylvania Early Learning Standards.

This week's theme was: **3 Little Pigs**

Read: Watch Miss Sherry read *The True Story of the Three Little Pigs!* by Jon Scieszka and *Huff and Puff* by Claudia Rueda on our Youth Services Facebook page.

Talk: Talk about how sometimes there are different points of view to a story, like Al's.

Sing: Rhymes To Do At Home

Play: Gather materials you have around your house. It could be plastic cups, cardboard, spaghetti, whatever you want. With your child, build a house and then see if you can huff and puff it down by blowing on it!

Write: Cut out, color, and make your own 3 Little Pigs book on the next page

Rhymes To Do At Home

Five Pigs So Squeaky Clean

(To the tune of "Five Green and Speckled Frogs") Five pigs so squeaky clean Cleanest you've ever seen Wanted to go outside and play Oink! Oink!
