Early Literacy Extras:

Parents and caregivers are a child's first and best teachers. Here are some ideas and activities to try this week with your child.

These five practices are designed to help your child develop literacy skills, engage your child, and enhance the bonds between you.

This week's theme was: Summer Nights

Read: Watch Miss Theresa read *Touch the Brightest Star* by Christie Matheson on our Youth Services Facebook page.

Talk: Talk about all the things you can see at night. There is so much happening when we're normally in bed. Research fireflies, or the Big Dipper, or nocturnal animals. You can read some books online

Sing: Rhymes To Do At Home

Play: Play a game of Firefly. This game is a kind of reverse tag in a darkened room or when the sun has set in which all the players are trying to capture one "it"—the firefly, who holds the flashlight. If you live in a place with real fireflies, you can add this game to a firefly catching adventure. Just be sure to release the bugs once you've had a good look at them.

Write: There are hundreds of stars in the sky every night. Some have been connected in a pattern: as a spoon, a bear, a Roman mythological character. Have your child find their own constellations on the next page.
