These five practices are designed to help your child develop literacy skills, engage your child, and enhance the bonds between you.

Read: Watch Miss Karin read *Saturday* by Oge Mora on our Youth Services Facebook page or YouTube Channel.

Talk: Sometimes things don't go the way we want them to go. What happens when they don't? Do you get mad? Do you try to make the situation better? Talk about some ways that you can make things better and how you can react calmly.

Sing: Rhymes to do at Home

Play: The best thing is when you get to spend time with someone you love. Choose a game together and play. It can be dress-up, a board game, a counting game. Whatever you want to do together.

Write: Make a card for the person you like to spend your day with.
