Early Literacy Extras:

Parents and caregivers are a child's first and best teachers. Here are some ideas and activities to try this week with your child. These five practices are designed to help your child develop literacy skills, engage your child, and enhance the bonds between you. Storytimes at the Adams County Library support Pennsylvania Early Learning Standards.

This week's theme was: Environment

Talk: Talk about the beautiful things that are in our world. What do you see in your neighborhood? What colors do you see? What shapes? What are some things that you can do to make Earth even more beautiful?

Write: Make your own planet. Glue scrap paper onto a piece of paper or paper plate and make your own Earth. If they're younger, find a globe or ball that might look like Earth and let them play and manipulate it.
