Early Literacy Extras:

Parents and caregivers are a child's first and best teachers. Here are some ideas and activities to try this week with your child. These five practices are designed to help your child develop literacy skills, engage your child, and enhance the bonds between you. Storytimes at the Adams County Library support Pennsylvania Early Learning Standards.

This week's theme is: **Bears**

Read: Watch Miss Emily read *We're Going on a Bear Hunt* by Michael Rosen on our Youth Services Facebook page or YouTube Channel.

Talk: Talk about the different types of bears on the other page. To learn more about bears, access children's online non-fiction books on our eLibrary through our homepage or by using your library card to access PowerKids through www.powerlibrary.org

Sing: Rhymes to do at Home

Play: Go outside and have your own adventure. What obstacles do you have to go through?

Write: Glue two toilet paper tubes together and tie a string to both rolls to make binoculars to go on your own bear hunt. If they are too young, let them play with a bear toy and make the noises bears make.
